

The rehabilitation of Senwabarwana town streets well in progress

Potholes in the Senwabarwana central business district will soon be a thing of the past. The construction of Senwabarwana Internal Streets and Stormwater Control Phase 1 project is well in progress. The project has a total budget of R20 343 660.89 and is scheduled to run for six(6) months.

SCOPE OF WORK SUMMARY

- * Site Clearance
- * Rehabilitation of base layer 977m
- * Laying of 80mm Paving blocks 2370m
- * Laying of pre-cast concrete kerbs
- * Layinng of 60mm Paving blocks (side walk)
- * Construction of openlined drains (V-drain and Trapezoidal drain with the bottom width of 1m and top width of 4m and 1m deep)- 400m.
- * Construction of 1200 mm diameter 100D stormwater pipeline with inlet and outlet structure 520m


DILAPIDATED ALLDAYS TOWNSHIP STREETS AND STORMWSTER CONTROL SYSTEM ARE GETTING A FIX

The rehabilitation of Alldays Internal streets and stormwater control Phase 1 project is well in progress. The Council approved the R14 773 444.88 budget in 2024/25 financial year for the project. The construction works have been scheduled for six (6) months.

THE SCOPE OF WORK SUMMARY

- The reconstruction of 1000m(1km) road with two pavement layers and 40mm asphalt surfacing and rehabilitation of other roads.
- Site Establishment

- Site Clearance
- Cut to spoil existing pavement layers
- Preparation of existing pavement layer
- Construction of two pavement layers (C4 Sub base, G3 Base)
- Storm water drainage (Manholes; catch pits and concrete v drain)
- Installation of Gabion and Reno Mattresses
- Kerbing and channeling
- Patch and repairing edge break
- Priming
- Surfacing (asphalt)
- Slurry Seal
- Road Marking
- Road furnisher





Mochemi, Mongalo and Sweethome extensions now have electricity

One hundred and sixty-five(165) households at Mongalo (70), Sweethome (70), and Mochemi (25) village extensions have been electrified. Mayor Maria Thamaga officially switched on their completed projects.

These projects were the municipality's response to requests made by community members during Intergrated Development Plan -IDP public consultation meetings.

Upon handing over the projects to the respective communities Mayor Thamaga called on community

members to buy electricity and refrain from meter tempering as those who will be found at fault risk their electricity disconnected and face a hefty fine of R10 000.

Mayor Thamaga also donated start-up electrical appliances to the three families where symbolic switch-on took place. Mayor accompanied by the Whip of Council, Cllr Johanna Rangata switched on the lights and also donated start-up electrical appliances. She further thanked those thar were involved in the project from the beginning to the end for a job well done.









Makwaeba family's dignity restored as MEC Basikopo Makamu hands over a newly built and fully furnished house

The livelihoods of the Makwaeba family at Witten Village (Ga-Marais) in Ward 19 have been changed for the better following the handing over of a new home.

On 30th January 2025, the Co-operative Governance, Human Settlement and Traditional Affairs (CoGHSTA) MEC, Mr Basikopo Makamu, accompanied by Blouberg Local Municipality Mayor Her Worship Cllr Maria Thamaga, Speaker, Cllr Blanco Boloka and the Whip of Council, Cllr Johanna Rangata handed over a fully furnished house to the family.

The beneficiary, 60-year old Ms Andricah Thete Makwaeba, was living in a one-roomed house with 15 members of her family, including siblings.

After being notified of the poor conditions the family lived in by Ward Councilor Shirley Raphasha, the department extended a helping hand to the family through collaboration with contractors and building them a house. MEC Makamu indicated that he is

continuing to engage donors to assist the family with other basic needs.

"We have built them a house, which is not enough. I had a chat with the family, and the mother here indicated her own children are 6 and 8 grandchildren. I've spoken to the people who donated this house to help us buy uniform for all school going children just to use it as an example that if we can encourage our children to go to school, they will be able to change their situations. We want to see the Makwaeba family grow like any other households here."

As part of their Social and Labour Plan (SLP), Crystal Salt and Bergpan Salt Works in partnership with Blouberg Local Municipality on April 1, 2025, conducted a groundbreaking ceremony marking the commencement of the installation of solar street lights project along the R521 route in Vivo area.

According to Mr Ephraim Mokoatedi, the SLP Officer, the project forms part of their commitment to enhancing the local community and infrastructure. "We are excited to announce the commencement of the project, which is aimed at improving street lighting and safety for the residents and travelers along the R521 route.

The solar street lights will contribute significantly to the safety, energy efficiency, and overall development in the area. "

In 2020/21 financial year, Blouberg Local Municipality Council approved Crystal and Bergpan Salt Works' SLP projects to the tune of R 957 000.

The municipality's first priority of the twelve priorities

crafted is local economic development, job creation, and partnerships as government alone can not do everything.

The Mayor, Her Worship Cllr Maria Thamaga extended her appreciation to the two companies, indicating that the municipality needs to partner with other role players to develop communities.

"The operations of these two companies, Crystal and Bergpan, have created fourty-two(42) permanent job opportunities. We are happy today that in partnership with Crystal and Bergpan, we are doing sod-turning for the solar street light project. During construction, this project will create ten (10) temporary job opportunities. "

The project scope includes the installation of seven(7) streets lights which will be powered by solar, the move Mayor Thamaga commended, indicating it will play a significant role in promoting the government's plan of using alternative sources of energy. "This will make a contribution to the reduction of load shedding.

Two other LED projects will be funded through their SLP projects. Their SLP projects link very well with our first priority as the municipality. We welcome and appreciate this milestone. Vivo will never be the same. It will look different through the solar street lights. "

BLOUBERG MUNICIPALITY SCOOPS FOUR SALGA AWARDS FOR NOT INCURRING THE UNAUTHORIZED EXPENDITURE IN 2023/24 FINANCIAL YEAR

It was all joy in Blouberg as management welcomed the awards the Blouberg Local Municipality scooped at the South African Local Government Association - SALGA MOSES "BIG MOSS" MALULEKE MUNICIPALAWARDS 2025 ceremony held on March 13, 2025 in Bela Bela.

Several municipalities were awarded trophies and certificates for their outstanding work in governance and financial management; by achieving the 100% percent spending on Municipal Infrastructure Grant(MIG) funding resulting in receiving additional funding, for not incurring unauthorized, fruitless and wasteful expenditure and for their audit outcome among other categories.

The Blouberg Local Municipality was recognised and received four accolades:

- For 100% MIG pending on initial allocation and receiving additional MIG Allocation.
- For Spending over 95% of the additional MIG Allocation
- 3. For not incurring the Unauthorized Expenditure during the 2023/24 audit cycle.
- 4. For not incurring Fruitless and Wasteful expenditure during the 2023/24 audit cycle.

The Mayor, Her Worship Cllr Maria Thamaga and Council Speaker, Cllr Blanco Boloka who received the awards on behalf of the municipality, proudly presented them to management. Mayor Thamaga thanked the leadership and management collective for the team effort and indicated that working together tirelessly a lot more can be achieved for the betterment of Blouberg.

Blouberg Local Municipality Mayor, Her Worship Cllr Maria Thamaga has welcomed the good governance recognition award presented to the municipality for its outstanding performance by Good Governance Africa (GGA) during the 10th Anniversary event held on, October 2, 2024 at The Venue, Melrose Arch in Johannesburg.

In March, the GGA through its Governance Performance Index (GPI) - 2024 ranking, ranked Blouberg Local Municipality Number 1 for the outstanding performance from the sixty-one (61) Category B4 - Mostly Rural Local Municipalities Category. According to GGA's Governance Insights and Analytics, Head of Programme, Ms Chrissy Dube, when conducting the ranking for best performing municipalities; the GGA checked how the municipality looks like from Service Delivery perspective, Audit, Administrative; Leadership and Governance, Planning and Development, Monitoring as well as other mandates. Service delivery is weighted most due to the importance the local government has in terms of distributing core services to households.

"The reason we are doing local government work is because between, national, provincial and local government, local government is the closest to the citizens and part of GGA's mandate is to improve the lives of citizens by empowering them to active citizenry by being accountable citizens that are able to hold the government to account, while we empowering the state to be a capable state. It is not a competition; GPI is a mirror for every municipality to look at. If you have seen where you ranked as a municipality in the GPI, we are able to do a deep dive, give you the reasons why you ranked where you ranked; where you are doing well and where you need to improve".

Handing over the GGA Awards of Recognition, Executive Director GGA East Africa, Ms Tina Asante-Apeatu indicated that, maladministration and corruption are shamed publicly and that, it is also crucial to recognize good governance performance publicly. Upon accepting the Award, Mayor Maria Thamaga, indicated that, the municipality will continue to do things by the book and prioritize its citizens in terms of service provision. The mayor further thanked GGA founder, Mr Robert Rose for the good work in advancing good governance in the continent.

"Thank you very much for the opportunity, I feel very much honoured on behalf of Blouberg Local Municipality to receive this Award of Recognition. This, says a lot about us as an institution. The GPI rating indicates our ability to deliver sustainable services regardless of how much we have, how we run our finances, the quality of the team work as Council, the planning and our administration in general.
