Re hlakanetša sehla se se seswa. It is about our arts and culture. It is about our heritage. It about who we are. A re tšweletšeng meaparo le mebino ka moka yeo e amanago le setšo sa rena. Let us show our true colours".

Equally, in government cycles September, is a month of service delivery. Mayor Thamaga indicated that, the Council is working tirelessly to ensure that the municipality continues to deliver sustainable services to communities.

"Re swanetše re tšeye ditirelo re di iše setšhabeng. We have been established to serve our communities. Our communities deserve better services.

Re le Masepala mokgweding ye ya ditirelo tša setšhaba re kgonne go fa batho ba Swartz (45 households), Bayswater (30 households), Mochemi (25 households), Mongalo (50 households) and Sweethome (70 households) mohlakgase. They are now having electricity like all of us. Palomoka ya malapa a 305 a humane mohlakgase mo ngwageneg wa 2023-24 go akeretšwa le Simpson (25) and Alldays (60).

We have also handed over sites to contractors for construction of the following roads for 2024 financial year; Kwarung, Thalane, Senwabarwana D1200(other critical streets within the town) and Alldays internal streets

Re kgonne go dira tše ka moka ka baka la tšhomišano le tlemagano le Magoshi a rena le ditšhaba tša rena. This cooperation and working together is part of our heritage".

In conclusion the extended her gratitude to traditional leaders for walking the service delivery journey with the municipality for the past three decades.

"As we celebrate 30 years of freedom and democracy we need to look back with pride. We come a long way walking side by side le Magoshi a rena.
