BLM BUYS NEW GRADERS

TO IMPROVE STATE OF THE MUNICIPAL ROADS

When she took office a year ago, one of the many challenges that the Mayor, Her Worship Cllr Maria highlighted was the shortage of motor graders for road maintenance programme.

The Mayor made an undertaking to ensure that graders are prioritised during the budgeting period to address gravel roads maintenance backlog.

On November 11, 2022 Mayor Thamaga unveiled three new graders to intensify road maintenance programme. The Mayor indicated that during public meetings most community members had complained about the poor state of the roads in the municipality.

" I have also been receiving calls on similar complaints from taxi associations and the general motorists requesting that the municipality and the Department of Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure continuously blade the roads while waiting for the tarring programme".

"The Council of Blouberg Local municipality in 2022/23 financial year budgeted for the three

graders to add on the current fleet of old graders to intensify road maintenance programme," said the Mayor upon unveiling the graders.

Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure MEC, Mme Nkakareng Rakgoale commended the municipality for the purchase of graders to address the current challenges on Blouberg roads.

MEC Rakgoale further indicated that Blouberg residents are fortunate to have a leader of Mayor Thamaga's caliber who is always out there with communities to experience their challenges first hand and be able to intervene.

LONG-AWAITED MULTI-MILLION RANDS SENWABARWANA SHOPPING MALL

Construction gets underway

The sod-turning ceremony conducted by Blouberg Local Municipality Mayor, Her Worship Cllr Maria, investors Rheinland Investments together with its partner, Masingita Group of companies joined by Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure MEC Nkakareng Rakgoale, Capricorn District Municipality Executive Mayor Cllr Mamedupi Teffo on November 11, 2022 marked the beginning of the construction of the state-of-the-art Senwabarwana Shopping Mall.

Together, the project partners invested R350 million into the development. The groundbreaking event was celebrated under the theme: "Unlocking Economic Potential For Socio-Economic Emancipation-BLOUBERG ON THE MOVE | 2022".

The investors are proud to bring this convenience to the town of Senwabarwana with their latest shopping centre development. Construction of the multi-million rands enclosed shopping mall is scheduled to commence on November 15, 2022 on Erf 300 formerly known as Senwabarwana Showground. The 24 000m² (square meters) project will be implemented in three phases. The first and second stages of construction will be at 18000m² extent with an eighteen(18) months schedule that will see the mall open its doors in April 2024.

The first phase will comprise a filling station and a food drive-through store, while the second phase of the project will be the construction of shops with two anchor tenants, the clothing stores, lifestyle stores, food court, pharmacies (medical facilities), taxi and bus drop off and pick up zone among others. The third phase of construction will be a 6000m² of build with an ideal of a double story building.

The last phase will have additional stores to accommodate clothing and food stores and an additional anchor tenant among others. There are franchise opportunities for restaurant and fast food operators and the construction of hawkers stalls for those operating small businesses aligning to the mall construction theme.

The development is a vision of the late businessman, Mr Theo Mphosi, son of Mr John Mphosi, the

Chairman of Rheinland Investments, a holding company for MTR Construction, Global Oil, Platinum Bulk and a number of Galitos stores among other businesses. Mr John Mphosi extended his gratitude to the municipality for having faith in the company and walking the difficult journey with them to ensure that the application for the construction of the mall is approved. He indicated that, the retail development will be tailored to the needs of the greater community of Blouberg. "Thanks to the Mayor, Municipal Manager and the team for working tirelessly to ensure that the project is approved. We have a good relationship with our development partner, Masingita Group, Mr Mike Nkuna, we are a family. We are currently finalizing some of the contracts with the tenants. It is fulfilling to be implementing this project here, at home. 1200 jobs will be created during construction stage and 400 during operations."

Municipal Manager Mr Refilwe Ramothwala indicated that the municipality is looking into ways to improve the (town)planning of Senwabarwana to align with the new development as many people will be flocking to town after the completion of the project.

Mayor Thamaga once more, extended her gratitude to Rheinland Investments for partnering with the municipality to develop Blouberg and improve the economic status of the municipality and its people. "When I got in office, public-private-partnership was one of the priorities and still is - to help us create employment opportunities for our people and improve our economic status. I want to see people of Blouberg have better lives. Through public-private-partnerships, we are able to do more for our communities, as the municipality cannot create jobs for everyone, however, together with the private sector, we can do more.

We are happy for the beautiful mall that is about to be constructed. The construction of the mall will cut shopping trips shorter to nearest towns like Louis Trichardt and Polokwane. We are going to be like other towns with big shopping malls and better shopping experience," said Mayor Thamaga.

Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure MEC Mme Nkakareng Rakgoale commended Rheinland

Investments and its partner for bringing a bigger shopping centre in Blouberg, highlighting that, the investment is the practicality of the public-private-partnership as alluded by the president. MEC Rakgoale also conveyed a message of appreciation from Local Economic Development, Environment and Tourism MEC, Mr Rodgers Monama to Rheinland Investments, Mr Mphosi and partner Masingita Group for their big role in local economic development, indicating that while many people lost jobs and companies closing doors during COVID-19 pandemic, Rheinland Investments is putting in investment that will create more jobs.

The memorable groundbreaking ceremony was graced by the presence of BLM Council Speaker, Cllr Blanco Boloka, Chief Whip of Council, Cllr Johanna Rangata, Members of the Executive Committee, Councillors, Kgoshi Abram Seakamela, Kgoshi Ngoako Maleboho, Kgoshi Kgabo Moloto III, Kgoshi Mamadi TA, Kgoshi Makgato KB and the representatives of Kibi Traditional Authority.

Dusty streets are being upgraded from Gravel to Tar

ALLDAYS PROJECT

The remaining dusty streets of Alldays Extension 2 and 3 are currently being tarred.

On 21 November 2022, The Mayor, Her Worship Cllr Maria launched the Alldays Phase 2 internal streets and stormwater control project.

The Mayor officially handed over the sites to the contractors for the construction of Alldays Phase 2 internal streets and stormwater control system and a Sub Station in Senwabarwana Town.

During IDP/budget public consultative meetings community members requested tarred internal streets and electricity among other things. The Council has approved the budget to attend to the requests.

Mayor Thamaga indicated that the municipality is delivering services to communities as mandated and that, she is pleased the projects will bring relief

SENWABARWANA PROJECTS

Dust will soon be a thing of the past on gravel streets around Senwabarwana Township. Mayor Thamaga launched two internal streets and stormwater projects on July 16, 2022.

The construction of Senwabarwana Phase 11 A and B internal streets and stormwater control projects are progressing well in Senwabarwana Ext 5 and Desmond Park areas. Phase 11A (Ext 5) project has a total budget of R17,317,729,76 and will cover 2.81 kilometers of road with construction work expected to run for a duration of 7 months. Phase 11B (Desmond Park) has been budgeted for R17, 067,552,50 to cover a total of 2.41 kilometers of road with a 7 months construction schedule.

Phase 11A (Ext 5) project has a total budget of R17,317,729,76 and will cover 2.81 kilometers of road with construction work expected to run for a duration of 7 months. Phase 11B (Desmond Park) has been budgeted for R17, 067,552,50 to cover a total of 2.41 kilometers of road with a 7 months construction schedule.

CONSTRUCTION OF

A New Sub-station and Electrification of Extensions

Blouberg Local Municipality is licensed to electrify households and businesses. On November 22, Mayor Maria Thamaga conducted a sod-turning ceremony marking the commencement of the construction of Senwabarwana Substation.

The Mayor indicated that the municipality is building a substation in Senwabarwana in order to keep up with electricity supply to homes and businesses in town and the surroundings.

During Integrated Development Plan/Budget - IDP public consultative meetings, community members requested electricity among other things. The Council has approved the budget to attend to the requests.

Mayor Thamaga indicated that the municipality is delivering services to communities as mandated. The Mayor further indicated that, she is pleased that the projects will bring relief to some families without income as temporary employment will be created. She further urged members of the community to refrain from organizing protest marches as that will delay the completion of the municipal projects and delivery of services in general.

Senwabarwana Substation has been budgeted for R20million with a six (6) months construction schedule.

ELECTRIFICATION OF ALLDAYS, LEKGWARA AND DIEPSLOOT EXTENSIONS

WOur communities shouldn't be afraid to have extensions as we are able to provide them with electricity. We are here today to launch "Lefifi O Kotsing" programme, to ensure that no community remains in the dark," said Mayor Thamaga upon launching the electrification projects at Ga-Legwara on November 11, 2022.

"We heard our people, and we have realized that in some of our communities there is high rate of poverty and as the municipality, we will work hard to ensure that poverty is eradicated in our communities through service delivery projects and creation of employment".

The extension households are scheduled to be electrified as follows:
Alldays (19 units) and Diepsloot (20 units) extensions will be electrified under one project at a budget of R600 000, while Lekgwara extension project with 40 households will cost the municipality R800 000. The three projects are expected to be completed in 3 months.

ELECTRIFICATION OF WITTEN EXTENSION

Six hundred and twenty-five (625) households at Witten Extension 10 will be connected to the national electricity grid through Blouberg Local Municipality electrification programme.

This follows the official handover of the project by the Mayor, Cllr Maria Thamaga on November 28, 2022. R10.6million has been approved by the Council to fund the project. The project is scheduled for six months.

Blouberg Local Municipality Mayor, Her Worship Cllr Thamaga officially hands over sites to contractors for the electrification of Witten, Alldays, Lekgwara, Diepsloot extensions as well as the construction of the new Senwabarwana Substation.

MAYOR LAUNCHES

AVON MULTI-PURPOSE COMMUNITY CENTRE PROJECT

Her Worship, the Mayor of Blouberg Local Municipality, Cllr Maria Thamaga on November 17 handed over site, officially marking the commencement of the construction of Avon Multi-Purpose Community Centre (MPCC).

The long-awaited Avon Multi-Purpose Community Centre which will comprise a community hall and offices among other items on scope of work will be constructed at a R5.9 million budget and the construction will be carried out for a period of 6 months.

Kgoshi Seakamela SA, has extended his appreciation to the Mayor, her Executive Committee (EXCO) and the entire Council of Blouberg for ensuring that the Avon MPCC project becomes a reality. " We have worked with Mayor Thamaga since 2012, the decision that the Mayor has taken to bring the Multi-Purpose Community Centre here at Avon, the agreement was part of the 2015/16 Integrated Development Plan (IDP)/Budget. We were then informed that the project couldn't be implemented due to budgetary constraints, however we are happy that God has heard our prayers and brought His daughter (Mayor Thamaga) to move us from Egypt to Canaan. She is here today to implement what we agreed upon. The Mayor also indicated that there will be another project, the electrification of Sewela Park. The Mayor wants to see this area with lights. We are still going to have more projects under her leadership, let us continue to support and pray for her to continue doing good to us and the communities of Blouberg," said Kgoshi Seakamela.

The projects will also provide a financial relief to those without income as a total of 20 jobs have been created.

CDM LAUNCHES NEW WATER PROJECT FOR ROSENKRANTZ COMMUNITY

On November 24, 2022, Mayor Thamaga joined Capricorn District Municipality Acting Mayor, the MMC for Corporate Services, Cllr Sammy Selamolela in the handover ceremony of new water project. The district municipality handed over water supply project at Rosenkrantz Village in Ward 21.

The project is budgeted for R42 Million with a 12 months construction schedule. The scope includes the following:

- Construction of 25 700m water pipeline
- Equipping and electrification of two boreholes.
- Installation of water treatment package plant
- Installation of two steel tanks with 250kl capacity each
- Installation of booster pump
- 280 metered yard connection as well as the fencing of borehole and storage facilities.

CDM EXECUTIVE MAYOR LAUNCHES NEW WATER PROJECTS IN BLOUBERG

Blouberg Local Municipality leadership led by the Mayor Her Worship Cllr Maria Thamaga on November 17, 2022, joined the Executive Mayor of Capricorn District Municipality, Cllr Mamedupi Teffo in launching the new water projects in Maleboho area. The new water projects were introduced to the communities by the Executive Mayor and are scheduled to be constructed as follows:

AREA : Milbank **BUDGET :** R37m

SCOPE OF WORK

- Construction of 46 000m pipeline
- Equipping and electrification of 2 boreholes
- Installation of package plant
- Installation of 116kl elevated steel tank and 950 metred yard connections
- Fencing of storage facility

AREA : Nairin **BUDGET :** R37m

SCOPE OF WORK

- Construction of 37 000m pipeline
- Equipping and electrification of 7 boreholes
- Installation of package plant
- Installation of 302kl elevated steel tank and 409 metred yard connections
- Fencing of borehole facility
- Fencing of storage facility

AREA : Nailana **BUDGET :** R22m

SCOPE OF WORK

- Equipping of existing borehole and electrification of pump house
- Construction of bulk rising main
- Reticulation of 75mm uPVC Class 9
- 190 metred yard connection
- Construction of 140kl elevated steel tank
- Construction of water treatment plant
- Installation of 1.8m high concrete palisade fence

The projects will soon commence with a construction schedule of 12 months (expected to be operational by December 2023). A call was also made to residents to look after their projects and to work together with the Blouberg and Capricorn District municipalities and the appointed service providers.



DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, ROADS AND INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS **ROAD D3278 TO BE TARRED**



On November 11, 2022 the MEC for Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure Mme Nkakareng Rakgoale, conducted a sod-turning ceremony at Thalane Village in Ward 14 that marked the commencement of the upgrading (gravel to tar) of Road D3278. The 10-kilometer of road connecting Blouberg Hospital and Buffelshoek Clinic will cost the department R96 million rands to construct.

Breaking the project funding down, Roads Agency Limpopo - RAL Chief Executive Officer, Mr Gabriel Maluleke indicated that, of the R96 million rands total budget, 30% will be dedicated to the empowerment of Small, Medium and Macro Enterprises (SMMEs) and highlighted that, the subcontracting of the project must favour local entrepreneurs. The 10% of the total budget will cater for job creation to benefit locals. The construction is scheduled for twelve (12) months period. Blouberg Local Municipality Mayor, Her Worship Cllr Maria Thamaga expressed her gratitude to the department for listening to the needs of the communities and be able to address them.

Department of Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure MEC, Mme Nkakareng Rakgoale accompanied by Blouberg Local Municipality Mayor, Her Worship Cllr Maria Thamaga, The Speaker of Council, Cllr Blanco Boloka, the Capricorn District Municipality Executive Mayor, Cllr Mamedupi Teffo, Kgoshi Ngoako Maleboho launch D3278 tarring project at Thalane Village.

Mayor Thamaga further indicated that, the upgrading of Road D3278 will reduce the backlog of roads that requires upgrading in the municipality. MEC Rakgoale, made a call to communities to look after their infrastructure. She further urged communities to refrain from damaging infrastructure when engaging in protests actions as that hampers service delivery. The MEC indicated that, instead of continuing with the service delivery programme, the department had to fix the damaged infrastructure which takes on the budget meant for new projects.



LAUNCH OF ROAD REPAIRS PROJECTS FOR D1200, D1468, D1589, AND R521 ROADS

On October 17, 2022, the Chairperson of the Portfolio Committee on Economic Development and Planning, Cllr Dan Mosena on behalf of the Mayor officially handed over sites to the contractor appointment by Roads Agency Limpopo (RAL) to implement potholes fixing projects in the municipality. The launch of the projects was conducted on road D1468 between Indermark and Vivo by conducting road marking works, The pothole patching projects is being implemented on roads; D1468 between Indermark and Vivo, D1589 towards Ga-Makgato, D1200 My Darling road and R521 towards Alldays Town.

Cllr Mosena indicated that, there was an outcry from the community regarding the poor state of the roads which compromised the safety of the residents. That, prompted the municipality to seek assistance from RAL. He further extended gratitude to the MEC for Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure, Mme Nkakareng Rakgoale and the roads agency for seeing to it that the community service delivery complaints are attended to by getting the roads fixed. "The government of the day has given us mandate to render services to the people. There was a serious outcry from the community regarding this road, which its status compromises the safety of the residents. Our appreciation to the MEC and Roads Agency Limpopo, we have taken our cries to them and they appointed the service provider to fix our roads".

The project has created 79 temporary employment opportunities to locals. Community members are happy that their cries did not fall on deaf ears as the government is attending to their requests, getting the roads fixed. Tebogo Maphoto from Indermark Village indicated that, the road (D1468), is unpleasant to drive in and believes that, it is the major contributing factor to number of motor accidents occurred in the area. "We are happy that something is being done because driving on this road especially at night is a nightmare. Once the road is fixed there will be a decline in the number of road accidents. Acting Mayor Mosena further called for co-operation among stakeholders to ensure the smooth running of the project and avoid unnecessary delays. "Let there be co-operation in this regard. Contractor, do your job with distinction, work hand in hand with Ward Councillors and the Chairperson of Infrastructure Development, Cllr Raseruthe whom will be doing oversight on these project."

The acting Mayor was accompanied by Members of the Executive Committee (EXCO), Cllr Agnes Raseruthe, Infrastructure Development Chairperson, Cllr Martin Tlouamma, Ward 12 Councillor Lucas Motsoko, Ward 7 Councillor William Mapunya and Technical Services Acting Director, Mr Jacob Maleka.
