The Key Note Address

Kgwedi tše tharo go tloga Julae go fihla Setemere 2008 e bile nako ya ditiragalo le dipolelo Masepaleng o mo botse wa Blouberg. Re tshepa kudu go re setšhaba sa Blouberg se kwišiša tšohle tše di diregilego le go bolelwa, kudu tše dimpe, gore dihlolwa ke eng. Re se makaleng goba go tsielega gobane tšohle di na le nako ya tšona le gona di huetšwa ke maemo a mangwe a tša bophelo. Go tla no dula e le nnete gore maemo a ekonomi le a dipolotike ka nageng a swanetše go šikinya le go ama modudi, mekgatlo, le makgotla ka moka a le go gona. Se se bohlokwa ke go itsharelela ka nnete le thapelo gore ge maemo a fetoga re lebele morago ka boikgantsho. Ge re tšwela pele re leka go tliša diphetogo a re phemeng ka thapelo re hlasele ka nnete.

Gareng ga ditiragalo tše re ikgantšhang ka tšona tše di diregilego lebakeng le re bolelang ka lona ke gore re hlomphilwe ka go fiwa maemo a bomong - gae bja Limpopo Legislature' Women Parliament. Basadi ba Blouberg e bi le ba mahlatse go kwa pego ka kgatelopele ya tiragatšo ya dipheto tše di tšerwego peleng go kaonafatša maemo le seemo sa basadi ka Profenseng ya Limpopo. Kgwekgwe ya Parliament "Business Unusual - All Power to Women" e matlafaditše le go holohloletša basadi ba Blouberg go ema ka maoto le go ikabela a bona maatla setšhabeng. Ke ka gona e se kgale basadi ba Blouberg ba kopaneng go hloma Blouberg Women's Forum ba itshwareletše go kgwekgwe ya "Business Unusual - All Power to Women." Ga re ga diphethokgolo tša Blouberg Women's Forum ke gore išago re sware Women's Parliament maamong a Masepala. Re tla etima boroko go netefatša gore se se a phethagala. Ga re lewe ke dihlolong go ipetha sefega le go iphaphathela matsogo go ba ba mathomo seleteng sa Capricorn go fihlella se re se fihleletšeng go thekga ntwaga ya tokologo ya basadi.

Ka Oktoboro re tla be re le Hlako Sports Ground ka Ward 3 mo la ka March re etela Ward 9 kua Bull - Bull Sports Ground. Mo dikopanong tše maloko a setšhaba sa rena a tla tšweletša dingongorego go ba ditheto tša bona mabapi le ditirelo tša Mmasepala go Makhanselara a bona. Badudi ba Blouberg ba tla dumelelana le rena gore ga se ra ka ra se be gona. Seyalemoya le kuranta ke tša bao maikemišetšo e se go go rarolla eupsa go raraganya, kudu ge batho ba go na ba sa swabe go šomiša maaka go fihlella dihlologelo tša bona. E tlang ka makatanamane re tle re boledišane ka mekgwa ye mekaone ya go rarolla mathata a rena le go potlakiša kabo ya diterelo. Dihlotlo tša Blouberg di tla rarollwa ke badudi ba Blouberg.

Go gongwe kgatišobakeng ye re bolela ka thapelo kgolo ya Blouberg. Ka yona re rapela e bile re kgopela dithapelo go bohle gore Modimo a thutše gore bana bao e sa le go ba timelela ka ngwaga wa 2005 ba malapa a ga Moitsi le Morapedi motseng wa Motlana ba humanege. Administrative Overview

The bad news was told through the media. The good news was not told. Thanks to the Blouberg News we have a platform to reassure the Municipality's stakeholders that not all is bad. A wrong picture was and continues to be painted that the Municipality faces total collapse. That conclusion is far fetched. The Municipality has approved all the required plans, especially the IDP/Budget and the Service Delivery and Budget Implementation Plan (SDBIP). Funds have been allocated for specific programmes and projects. It is our duty as the Administration to implement all that which the Council has prioritized with the adoption of the IDP and Budget. In our SDBIP we outline our service delivery road map. Should there be challenges or the need to revise any of the major programmes and projects the Council would be the first to know. After every three months, as indicated in our IDP Process Plan, we will be retreating to assess our progress and rework or reconfirm our tactical and operational plans so that we do not fail. We want to continue focusing on the job at hand and refuse to be detracted by anyone or anything.

It is official, the Desmond Park case has been laid to rest. The last court order which instructed the Municipality to lay concrete floor slabs in the 67 shacks concerned has been implemented to its letter and spirit. Notwithstanding the court's ruling on the Desmond Park debacle, forceful occupation of land at Desmond Park and anywhere else remains illegal and counter productive and shall now and always be opposed. The Municipality in collaboration with the Department of Local government and housing will service more than one thousand sites at Senwabarwana town to alleviate the huge housing shortage in this fast growing town. Desmond Park and the 97 Sites Section of Senwabarwana are being electrified this

financial year. There are other major projects around Senwabarwana so that soon Senwabarwana would become both a business and residential destination and pride for us all.

The municipality has been appointed the Water Services Provider through an agreement signed with the Capricorn District Municipality. As a result Blouberg Municipality will monitor and supervise local water provisioning programmes especially on operations and maintenance. The challenges related to burst pipes, broken machines, pump operators shall in future be directly attended to by Blouberg Municipality. The former DWAF employees will be working closely with the Municipal staff to provide this basic service to the entire society. It is farewell to the days when it had become normal for water related problems to be fixed after protracted time and engagements. We applaud the Capricorn District Municipality for the step in the right direction.

The 2008/9 projects are on course. All projects courtesy of the MIG have been adjudicated upon. Picks and shovels are on site soon. The Electrification projects are also underway despite delays occasioned by the escalation of prices on materials, especially regarding the projects we should have implemented in 2007/8.

He who sees or knows of any corrupt activities affecting the Municipality has a duty to expose them. We spoke at length previously about the municipal policies and national legislation that are available as weapons to fight corruption. Recently the Council approved another progressive policy, the Corporate Gifts Policy, among other things, to outline the kind of gifts that councilors and staff of the Municipality may give or accept and procedures attendant thereto. While appreciating the normal magnanimity of giving gifts being, inter alia, to lubricate relations; to appreciate the corporate or individual's contribution to certain courses; or to promote corporate brands, the policy is cognizant of, and intends to pluck the possibility of mala fides such as to buy favours and to influence certain decisions in favour of those who give gifts. Council further approved the revised communication strategy to accentuate our performance and excellence in public participation. The following have been prioritized as by - laws to be developed this financial year : Hiring of Municipal premises and Amenities, Customer care and Revenue Management, Accommodation Establishment, and Barbers, Hairdressers and Beauticians.

THE SPEAKER SPEAKS

In the beginning there was nothing. When the First Council of the Blouberg Municipality was constituted a few years ago, in December 2000, it had to put everything in place at once for it to perform its constitutional mandate.

There were no systems; no human resources; no experience; no policies; But we knew that we had to provide leadership and services to the community of Blouberg. We did not have the luxury of time to always perfect the how part of it. In less than a year we had already received a couple of memorandums from communities who complained of lack of leadership, services and development. Our people would not take for an answer lack of systems; lack of human resources; lack of experience; or lack of policies as reasons why we were not able to move at speed. In the absence of these cornerstones of good governance we were gravely exposed.

In no time we said let there be an extraordinarily good communications strategy and we would have public marches no more. Indeed a strategy that would be confirmed by history as the best thing that came out of Blouberg in the first decade of the 21st century was developed. Its uniqueness and effectiveness have been due to its pragmatism. In no time we had become the envy of our peers as we were showered with accolades left, right and center as one of the best models of participatory democracy. We had created platforms for every voice to be heard. We remain indebted to our visionary traditional authorities who embraced the proposed working relationship with the Municipality and have stuck to it ever since. Our Mayor/Magoshi Forum should live eternally because it is what the people of Blouberg deserve.

In accordance with our communication strategy we said let there be Ward Committees and they sprung up. In less than six years we have established and are running a vibrant ward committees system. We have ward committees that fully understand that they are apolitical structures. Recently when we had to attend the ward committees conference some people approached ward committees to boycott the conference for what smacked of political machiavellian. Ward Committees defied and attended the conference in their numbers. This was the 6th Conference which was unfairly criticized as a wasteful and useless exercise. It could not be. It was a planned event and if it has to be discontinued Council should be able to do so when it approves its next budget. We hope the value of this forum would be fairly considered if a decision was to be taken to discontinue this six years old annual event. If truth be told, all municipalities in the district, including

the Capricorn District Municipality itself, have smelt the coffee and annually hold ward committees conferences.

Ours is a vibrant system which we are not ashamed to jealously defend. At the time of writing this piece ward committees were accompanying their ward councilors to report back to their constituencies on municipal affairs for the first quarter of the year. The second quarter report back session takes place from 01 - 31

BLOUBERG MUNICIPALITY ON THE FASTEST GEAR OF DELIVERY

Three villages under the Blouberg Municipality have had joy of switching-on electricity for the first time. Blouberg Municipality has spent over 2 million rand to electrify the villages of Kgokonyane Eusorinca and The Grange to benefit 569 households and businesses. It is the municipality's target, through a programme dubbed "Operation Leswiswi Okotsing" to have all its villages electrified by 2009/2010 financial year.

Since the launch of operation "Leswiswi o kotsing" in 2006 many villages within Blouberg Municipal jurisdiction have been electrified. Blouberg municipality has started its financial year on July 1 in which the Mayor has pronounced after President Thabo Mbeki that it will be business unusual at the municipality. The municipality will continue to put service delivery high on the agenda

July 16, this is the day that the lives of Kgokonyane residents in Ward 1 changed for the better as they switched-on electricity. The event that was held at Phuti Matlou primary school attracted the young and the old. Residents danced with joy. The switch -on at Kgokonyane took place at Mosima Phukubye's house. The switch on was officiated by Councilor Donald Ratladi on behalf of Blouberg Municipality Mayor, Cllr Refilwe Kubyana.

Delivering the keynote address on behalf of the mayor, Cllr Ratladi mentioned that when the new arrangements for local municipalities started, ward 1 was one of the areas which did not enjoy services during the transition period. "As council of Blouberg municipality we resolved that such wards needed a serious service delivery interventions, we indeed concerted our efforts to making sure that a lot of resources were channeled into those wards. We are proud that we have made a breakthrough. However we cannot say that we have arrived - there are challenges, and challenges will always be there. We still have a long way to go."

Less than a week later the same joy was extended to the villages of Setoking and Eusorinca when on the 22nd July the two villages were also switched on. The switch-on in these two villages took place at the child headed families of Nkweng and Molokwane respectively. The Municipality also donated food parcels to these needy families.

Addressing a joint function to celebrate the switch on The Acting Mayor, Cllr Ratladi indicated that in terms of the millennium development goals all villages must have access to electricity and free basic services by 2012. He said electricity being provided to these villages meant that women will no longer scavenge firewood from the bush and people will be able to run their businesses more profitably. He also urged residents to use electricity sparingly.

Blouberg Local Municipality has embarked on cleaning campaign in a bid to encourage cleanliness among Blouberg residents and conscientize communities about healthy environment. On the 8th 2008 municipal officials, councilors and volunteers went all out to the streets and public institutions amongst other places in Senwabarwana town picking up rubbish. Themed "Keep your town clean, keep your school clean" the cleaning campaign was part of the municipal preparation for the looming Cleanest Town competition - a government initiative started in 2006 to promote a safe and healthy environment as required by section 152 (d) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996.

Last year the dreams of the Blouberg municipality's waste employees came to reality as they scooped the most improving municipality award in the same competition. The Municipality smiled all the way to the bank with a R30, 000 cheque.

Blouberg Local municipality is the only municipality in Limpopo that is currently collecting waste direct from the rural villages. The Municipality has bought a waste compactor in order to further extend this service to other villages. " We dream of being in the same league with Baphalaborwa and Tzaneen which have been doing exceptionally well in the cleanest town competitions," said Mr Fannie Ranku, Manager in charge of cleaning and waste removal services at the Blouberg Municipality. Mr Ranku appealed to residents not to litter and to assist the Municipality to keep their living spaces clean.

affairs of the municipality. Delivering her keynote address Blouberg Municipal Mayor, Cllr Refilwe Kubyana, highlighted that municipalities as the local sphere of the government have a great deal to insure that government programmes are well known to all structures of the community to actively participate and improve their socio - economic status.

Blouberg Local Municipality has been rated amongst few municipalities with best practices in terms of public participation. This has prompted the Department of Provincial and Local Government to approach the Municipality in a bid to find the secret behind the Municipality's success in public participation, and to learn how best the practices can be transferred to other

municipalities to enhance public participation in the country. Cllr Kubyana explained that the success behind her municipality's public participation derives from engaging the locals on municipal issues.

"As Blouberg Municipality we are on track as far as community participation is concerned. This process is witnessed by the Council outreach programmes that we are embarking on, Our Council meetings are held at the villages, we conduct IDP Public Participation in every ward and there are Mayor/Magoshi session where the mayor and Traditional Leaders converge to discuss amongst themselves issues on service delivery".

Community Participation strengthens the connection between government and the people. In this conference ward committee members were afforded an opportunity do share with the mayor, speaker and municipal senior officials problems they encounter on daily basis and what their expect from the municipality.

Good work by ward committees did not go unnoticed. Ward 4 was rated the best in 18 municipal wards looking at its public participation, while ward 10 scooped the award for the most consistent ward committee.

THE BLOUBERG PRAYER

Blouberg Municipality, together with its sister municipality, Capricorn District Municipality (CDM), brought together masses of Blouberg at the prayer with a view to revive hope and give strength to the families that lost their two children. The prayer was held in respect of two children who went missing in 2005.

The prayer was held in partnership with SAPS, Childline and different religious formations at Motlana village in Blouberg on June 27 2008. The event started at Moitsi family. Blouberg Mayor Councilor Rifilwe Kubyana and CDM Executive Mayor Cllr Motalane Monakedi and the church leaders met with the two grieving families of Moitsi and Morapedi. Thapelo Morapedi and Kgomotso Moitsi were last seen on the afternoon of 17 September 2005. Their disappearance prompted a frantic search by police and the community without locating their whereabouts.

The police even looked beyond the confines of Blouberg and extended their investigative machinery to other parts of the district. The children could not be found.

Blouberg Municipality Mayor Cllr Refilwe Kobyana has appealed to the traditional leaders to join hands in bringing to an end the scourge of children abduction.. She said growing incidents of children going missing are an insult to the ancestors and should be brought to an end.

Inspector Hlahla of SAPS appealed to the families not to give up. " The case is now in the hands of the provincial SAPS who have impeccable intelligence to make a breakthrough", said Hlahla. He said the SAPS has put aside 50 000 reward to offer anybody who can come up with information that could lead to the trace of the missing children. "Tip off can be given to the police on condition of anonymity and we will give you a reward and treat the information with confidentiality", he said.

In giving a message of support Ms Prescilla Molaudzi advised parents to make use of Child Line by calling 0800 055 555. "It's our hope that the missing children will come back, we understand the pain, confusion, devastation and depression you are going through. "As Child Line We are right behind you", she said.

ELECTRICITY FIRST - Everything Else Later

Blouberg Municipality Mayor, Cllr Refiloe Kubyana has urged residents of Blouberg not to lose hope in the municipal system. Cllr Kubyana was reacting to grievances mainly concerning electricity, aired by the residents of Makgabeng at Oldlongsigne during her Imbizo.

The mayor's visit to the community was to find out the challenges the people of Makgabeng face on daily basis and to brief them about the progress - as to how far the municipality is in terms of delivering basic services in their area. It is a standard practice that after every ordinary Executive Committee (EXCO) meeting the Mayor hosts an imbizo as part of the municipal programme of enhancing community participation. The practice is also done after every council meeting as Blouberg EXCO and Council sessions are not convened at the offices but are convened at villages on a rotational basis.

Electricity was the main heed raised by the residents of Makgabeng during the Imbizo held at Thabamontsho primary school on Wednesday, July 31. The residents have complained claiming that they have been waiting for electricity since 2003. The electrification project in villages within the municipality has since been fast-tracked following the launch of a programme dubbed "Operation Leswiswi Kotsing". The municipal initiative launched in 2006, is aimed at electrifying all Blouberg settlements by 2009/2010 financial year. Through this project a number of villages have bid farewell to darkness. Meanwhile seventeen villages will be electrified before 2010.

casual labours. There's about 40% of women representation in governance and administration at both Provincial and Local Government according to Modipa. "Many women have been empowered, we have audited women companies and we are happy that a number of companies are owned by women," she said.

Louisa Gegezengele of the Thabazimbi Women's Club said government should support women to establish poverty alleviation projects in their areas which will bring social and economic development. The Legal Consequences Of Contravening The Building Regulations And Standards

The National Building Regulations and Building Standards Act 1977, (Act No. 103 of 1977) as well as the regulations promulgated thereunder, prescribe uniform building standards by setting out the requirements to ensure that buildings are designed and built in such a way that they are both healthy and safe. It also sets out legal consequences for failure by any person to comply with the regulations. In terms of the Act, any person wishing to erect a building must first submit a plan and use conventional materials in accordance with the principles of good building practice.

Submission of a building plan

Any person erecting a new building or effecting alterations that add onto or change the structure of an existing building must have approval to do so. This

approval is obtained by the submission of a building plan to the local offices of the municipality. Should any person commence building without first obtaining permission from the municipality, a building inspector may enter the premises and direct that construction be stopped immediately. The owner of the building may also be directed to demolish the building if it is found to be unsafe, constructed of unconventional materials or do not comply with any provision of the Act or the zoning regulations of the Town Planning Scheme. The municipality can also apply for a court order for the building to be demolished at the owner's cost. The owner of the building could also be liable for legal costs, and in serious cases, could also be fined or imprisoned. Following are some of the offences created by the Act and the fines that can be meted for contraventions:

The municipality of Blouberg has taken a decision to strictly enforce these regulations to preserve the aesthetic value of its towns and residential areas. All people living within the area of Blouberg should therefore ensure that they comply with the principles of good building practices by erecting their buildings in accordance with the requirements laid down in the Act and the regulations to avoid serious consequences.

How to obtain approval for building plans

Every prospective builder should submit a building plan drawn by a qualified architect or draught's person to the Building Inspectorate offices in the Department of Economic Development and Planning, Blouberg Municipal Offices, 2nd Building Senwabarwana Mogwadi Road, Senwabarwana.
