BIOUBERG MUNICIPALITY ACTIVATES MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE RENEWAL DRIVE THROUGH SYSYTEM –FISRT IN THE PROVINCE AND SECOND IN THE COUNTRY.

The Blouberg local Municipality has a dedicated a special office for the people with the Motor Licenses Vehicle (MLV2) notices for the annual renewal of the motor vehicle licenses in form of a drive through/drive thru.

The smart system was officially activated by the first resident of Blouberg, His Worship Cllr Maseka Pheedi at the Senwabarwana Driving License Testing Centre (DLTC) on the 21st of February 2018.

According to Mayor Pheedi, the arrangement is aimed at accelerating service and efficiency at the municipality's registering authority.

"Now that the drive through system has been enabled queues will be shortened and the station will generally accommodate a high number of people because of the pace with which work will be done" said Chief Licensing Officer Mr Jimmy Mpya.

This is a brief summary of how the drive through works:

The driver drives through the window manned by an e-Natis official, then produces an MVL2 notice (pictured) and pays the prescribed fee to the official. The official will then load the driver's details into the system, the machine then reads while the driver wait, generates and prints the renewal certificate (disc) without hustle(as pictured).

Council Speaker Mme Maria Thamaga, members of the portfolio committee on community services (responsible for traffic and licensing services) led by Chairperson: Cllr Johanna Rangata, Community Services Acting Director, Mr Domola Molea and Licensing Manager Mr Jimmy Mpya accompanied the Mayor.
